



Coolidge Cason

October 13, 1924 - September 1, 2008

Coolidge Cason, 83, of Berry, passed away on Monday, September 1, 2008, at his home. Born on October 13, 1924 in Harrison County, Kentucky, he was the son of the late Robert and Mae Meeks Cason. On October 4, 1956, he married Anna Frances Humphries Cason, and his dear wife of 52 years survives his passing. For 55 years he was a self-employed contractor and carpenter. He was also a former owner and operator of Berry Lumber Company. He was a lifelong member and elder of the Berry Christian Church, a former member of the Knights of Pythias, a former Berry Boy Scout Master, and a former member of the Berry Lions Club and the Taylor Masonic Lodge, Berry. For many years he sang in both of the Waymakers and the Good News Gospel Quartet.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his sister, Bertha Williams.

In addition to his wife, Anna Frances Humphries Cason, he is survived by two sons: Tony (Marti) Cason of Columbus, Ohio and Mark Cason of Berry, Kentucky; a daughter, Jana (Scott) Bottoms of Danville, Kentucky; 8 grandchildren: Nicole and Andrew Cason, Jacqueline (Jody) Culp, Chelsea Cason, Chad and Clay Young, Kyle and Blake Bottoms; two nieces, Delores Buehler and Carol Cole.
