Biography

David Richard Kaplan, 87, of Falmouth, Kentucky, passed away on Monday, May 24,

2010. Born in Rochester, New York, on May 3, 1923, he was a son of the late Lester and Beatrice Chait Kaplan. He graduated from Hobart College in New York.

In 1952, he married Virginia Lucille Tomlin Kaplan, and his dear wife survives his passing. From 1963 to 1983, he was a dedicated math teacher to the students of Pendleton County. He was a disabled Army veteran of World War II, a member of the Orion Lodge F & A M, Falmouth, and a member of the Pendleton County Retired Teachers Association.

In addition to his wife of 58 years, Virginia Lucille Kaplan, he is survived by five children: Virginia Smith of Lexington, Kentucky, John B. Kaplan of Florence, Kentucky, Lorrie Parrott of Independence, Kentucky, Mickey Parrott of Hillsboro, Ohio, and Sandy Klee of Independence, Kentucky; 7 grandchildren; and 6 great grandchildren; one brother, Samuel Kaplan of Del Ray Beach, Florida; and several nieces and nephews.

A graveside memorial service will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, June 4, 2010, at the Riverside Cemetery, Falmouth.
