



## Alice Eliza Ingram

May 15, 1919 - August 12, 2011

Alice Eliza Kendall Ingram, 92, of Berry, passed away on Friday, August 12, 2011, at her home. Born on May 15, 1919 in Berry, Kentucky, she was a daughter of the late Thomas and Willie Wayne Miller Kendall. She was a homemaker, a member of the Berry Christian Church, a former member of the Harrison County Homemakers, and a former 4-H Leader.
