Charles Robert Lemmon Jr., 90, of Falmouth, passed away on Friday, August 14, 2009 at the Hospice of the Bluegrass-Northern Kentucky Care Center in Ft. Thomas, KY. Born on April 12, 1919, he was son of the late Charles Sr. and Flora Conley Lemmon. He married Erma Fay Lemmon and she preceded him in death on April 17, 1990. He was a 1937 graduate of the Falmouth High School, U.S. Army veteran of World War II, member of the Pendleton County Historical Society, Hardin-Browning post #109 American Legion, Member and Elder of Morgan Christian Church, Falmouth Rotary Club; where he was named Mr. Rotary and awarded "service above self" award in 2009, and owner of Lemmon's Jewelry Store in Falmouth from 1946-1997 when he retired.
