



Geoffrey Lawrence Scanlon

October 16, 1943 - April 20, 2021

Geoffrey Lawrence Scanlon, 77, of Falmouth, KY, passed away on Tuesday, April 20, 2021 at his home. Born on October 16, 1943 in Ft. Wright, KY, he was a son of the late Joseph and Wanda Bales Scanlon. On November 14, 1987 he married Janet Roessler Scanlon and she survives his passing. Geof was a director for Business Network International (BNI) in Southwest Ohio, as well as a Referral Institute Certified Trainer and Mentor; where he gave more than 1400 presentations around the country. He was a CPA, a Registered Rep (Series 7 and 63), and a life and health insurance agent in KY and Ohio. He was the founder and president of Scanlon and Associates, Inc, as well as a published author. Geof started BNI in Cincinnati-Northern Kentucky. He built an incredible operation from the ground up; one that still leads the US to this day. Over those 27 years in BNI, Geof positively impacted the lives of his team, BNI members, and so many others. He was a true professional, an inspirational leader, and a friend and mentor to so many. Geof's community and civic contributions included serving on the board of the St. Elizabeth Hospital Foundation, Kenton County Boys and Girls Club, Children's Home of Northern Kentucky, and the Grateful Life Foundation.

In addition to his wife Janet, he is survived by a daughter, Kelly (David) Flesch of Ft. Wright, KY, 3 grandchildren, Emma, Mattie, and Ben Flesch, and 5 siblings, Catherine, Beth, Brigid, Lesley, and Greg.

He was preceded in death by 2 sons, Brady and Brennan Scanlon.

Funeral services will be private and at the convenience of the family. Burial will

take place in the St. Mary Cemetery in Ft. Mitchell, KY.
