John William “Johnny” Monroe, Jr., 80, of Falmouth, KY, passed away on Tuesday, October 23, 2018, at St. Elizabeth Health Care in Edgewood. Born on May 19, 1938 in Pendleton County, KY, he was the son of the late John William Monroe, Sr. and Burnette Ravenscraft Monroe. A 1956 graduate of Falmouth High School, Johnny married Bonnie Moore Monroe on December 6, 1958, and his dear wife survives his passing. Johnny worked as an engineer with the Kentucky State Highway Department for 38 years. He was a member of the Falmouth Baptist Church and a former member of the Falmouth Lions Club and the Falmouth Jaycees.

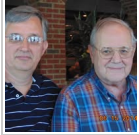
