John Robert "Bob" Schweitzer, 83, of Cynthiana, KY, a loving husband, father, grandfather, and great grandfather, passed away on Christmas Eve, Friday, December 24, 2021, at his home, surrounded by his family. Born on February 28, 1938, he was the son of the late Howard and Pearl Cotter Schweitzer. On May 6, 1961, he married Janet Lee Kremer, and his dear wife survives his passing. Bob retired after 30 years of service with Cincinnati Gas and Electric (now Duke Energy) as a gas line mechanic and inspector. 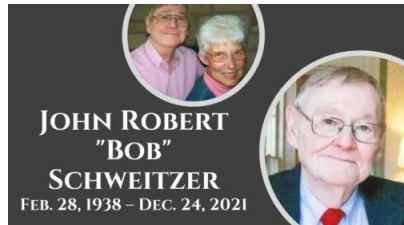
