Mary C. Cordray, 99, of Falmouth, Kentucky, passed away on Sunday, August 26, 2018, at the River Valley Nursing Home in Butler, Kentucky. Born on June 8, 1919 in Pendleton County, Kentucky, she was a daughter of the late Thomas and Julia Ritzler Coleman.

On June 24, 1944, she married Everett J. "Jiggs" Cordray, and her dear husband of 62 years preceded her in death on December 3, 2006. She was a homemaker, the oldest member of the St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church, and a member of the Pendleton County Senior Citizens.
