Mary Elizabeth Withers, 69, of Berry, KY, passed away on Sunday, March 11, 2018, at her home. Born on July 28, 1948 in Harrison County, KY, she was a daughter of the late Benjamin Hilton and Velma Aletha Blades Withers. She was a USPS Clerk with the Cynthiana Post Office, and formerly, she served as a Postmistress with both the Berry and Corinth Post Offices. Mary was a member of the Boyd United Methodist Church, Harrison County.
