Melbourne M. Angell, 80, of Falmouth, passed away on Friday, September 15, 2017, at the Kenton Pointe Care Center in Maysville. Born on July 21, 1937 in Pendleton County, KY, he was the son of the late Alvis Martin and Essie Gruelle Angell. On February 24, 1960, he married Joan E. Aulick, and his dear wife survives his passing.

He retired as head custodian with the Disabled American Veterans (DAV), and he was a farmer. Melbourne served in the U.S. Air Force.
