Orman "O.W." Conrad, Jr., 74, of Falmouth, KY, passed away at his home on Monday, January 9, 2023. He was born on October 13, 1948 to the late Alice Allender and Orman Conrad, Sr. O.W. grew up on the farm, where he developed a love for gardening which carried on throughout his lifetime. On June 5, 1971 he married Billie Tussey Conrad, and for the next 51 years the two of them would build a life of faith and family together.

O.W. was a retired teacher from Pendleton County Schools and a faithful member of the Trinity Southern Baptist Church in Falmouth. He also was a lifetime member of the FFA and served for several terms on the board for the Oneida Baptist Institute.

Along with his wife, Billie, O.W. is survived by his children: Kevin (Sonya) Conrad of Union, KY; Debra Conrad of Lexington, KY; Hannah Conrad and Matthias Conrad, both of Falmouth, KY; grandchildren Isaac Conrad, Keaton Conrad, and Kolston Conrad; and brothers John Conrad and Dale Conrad. He is also survived by a host of former students, family, and friends.

Visitation for O.W. will take place on Friday, January 13, 2023 from 3PM-7PM at the Trinity Southern Baptist Church in Falmouth. Funeral services will follow at 7 PM also at the church, with Bro. Abram Crozier officiating.
