Orville Ingram, 96, of Berry, passed away on Saturday, January 21, 2012, at Elm Croft in Florence, KY. Born on July 1, 1915 in Harrison County, Kentucky, he was the son of the late Hiram and Hattie Anna McNeese Ingram. He was a retired farmer, a member, Elder, and a former Sunday School teacher at the Berry Christian Church, and a former 4-H leader. On December 22, 1937, he married Alice Eliza Kendall Ingram, and his dear wife of 73 years preceded him in death on August 12, 2011.

In addition to his parents and wife, he was preceded in death by his daughter, Lena Sue Ingram on May 1, 1940, his granddaughter, Kathy Shanklin on January 29, 2011; and three brothers: Leland, Eugene, and Hayward Ingram.
