Stanley Thomas Bishop, 90, of Falmouth, passed away on Friday, February 8, 2019, at the Grand Haven Nursing Home in Cynthiana. Born on November 27, 1928 in Pendleton County, KY, he was the son of the late Mager and Mattie Mae Cummins Bishop.
