Virginia Lucille Tomlin Kaplan, 95, formerly of Pendleton County, KY, passed away on Saturday, June 15, 2024. Born in Pendleton County on February 1, 1929, she was a daughter of the late James Rollin and Virginia Ann Fryer Tomlin. In 1952, she married David Richard Kaplan, and together they raised their family and made countless memories for 58 years before he preceded her in death on May 24, 2010.
